**HAMPTON POOL**  
Head Coach, Toronto Argonauts.

Pool is a veteran of four years playing and five years coaching in the National Football League. He joined the Argos last season.

He is generally regarded as the successor to George Halas and Clark Shaughnessy in developing innovations for the T formation. With the Los Angeles Rams his offense led the league from 1950 to 1954.

A native Californian, he attended high school at Paso Robles and played college football at California, Stanford. From 1940 to 1943, he played right end for the Chicago Bears where he began to formulate his ideas on T offense.

He was a frogman at Fort Pierce during the war and coached that base's club to an undefeated season. In 1947, he coached the Miami Seahawks and the following season coached the Chicago Rockets of the old All American Conference. In 1949 he moved to California to coach San Jose State College.

In 1950 and '51 he was offensive coach for the Los Angeles Rams and from 1952 to '54 he was head coach. With his Fly T offense he won two division and one world's title with the Rams.

He has three children, a daughter Suzanne and two sons, Johnny and Bobby.

**JOE THOMAS**  
Assistant Coach.

Though only in his 30's Thomas has been in the coaching business for the past 11 years. A tough, thorough type, he gained a reputation for his defenses in the NFL. In 1954 he coached the Baltimore Colts line which averaged 254 pounds. In 1955 and '56 he was with the Los Angeles Rams.

Thomas played basketball and football at Ohio Northern University. He was also a fine baseball player and once had the opportunity to join the Cleveland Indians chain.

During the war Thomas was a Chief Petty Officer in charge of physical training and played end for the Bainbridge (Maryland) and Great Lakes navy teams.

He began coaching at high schools in Indiana and was Indiana coach of the baseball team at DePauw University during that period. For two years commencing in 1952, he was line coach and assistant basketball coach at Indiana U. He moved from there to the Colts.



**STEVE OWEN**

Defensive coach. Owen was 29 years with the New York Giants of the NFL. In partial retirement after winding up his career with the Philadelphia Eagles, Steve was persuaded by Hamp Pool to join the Argos. Noted for his tireless efforts to develop a football player who shows the slightest talent. Owen went to New York in 1926 to play one game against the Giants with the Kansas City Cowboys and stayed for nearly 30

years. As a coach since 1931 he covered the eras of the iron men, the forward pass and the two platoon system. He won eight sectional championships with the New Yorkers.





**GEORGE STOCKWELL**  
Office Manager

This is Stockwell's 30th season with the club. Up until 1954, he served a dual purpose as Argo head trainer and, in the off season, working in the office. Started training immediately after discharge following the First World War. He broke in with the Maitland lacrosse and hockey teams. Came to the Argos in 1928 and worked under coaches Buck McKenno, Lew Hayman, Ted Morris, Frank Clair and Bill Swiacki. Married with five children. Hobbies: beagling for rabbits and fox, and fishing.

**TED MORRIS**

When Ted joined the Argos in 1956 after retiring in 1950, he was given the job of scouting and developing Canadian talent.

Morris played on the 1933, 1937 and 1938 winners then ended his career after the 1939 season and turned to coaching. He was Argo assistant coach under Lew Hayman in 1941 and 1942. He coached the Navy team in 1942, '43 and '44 and won a championship in the latter year.

In 1945 he returned to the Argos to build one of Canadian football's all time great teams. This club brought the Grey Cup to Toronto in 1945, 1946 and 1947.

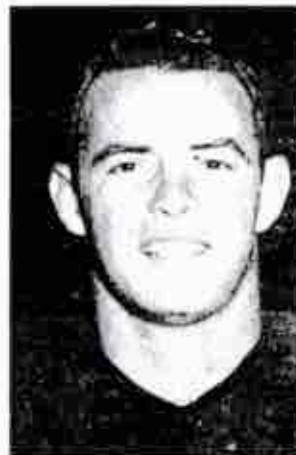


### HENRY HAIR

Born in Southampton 41 years ago, Art played County Soccer in that area and was a pretty fair track and field man specializing in 100 and 200 yard dashes. He served with the R.A.F. during World War 2 as a wireless operator and a gunner on operational duty for a year and a half.

On his arrival in Canada, he worked as a machinist. Became trainer with Balmy Beach seven years ago. He took over the Argo Trainer duties this season succeeding Dick Buday. Art's assistant is Ray Peak.
