RIDER COACHING STAFF



KEN CARPENTER

Head Coach

After six years as an outstanding halfback with the Saskatchewan Roughriders, Ken accepted the Head Coaching position shortly after the close of the 1959 season.

It was always his ambition to take up a career in coaching after his playing days were finished. It is a real challenge in taking over a last place club, but Ken predicts the 1960 Riders, though lacking in experience, will have the spirit and desire to produce a winning club.

Born in Oregon, Ken attended Oregon State University where he was an outstanding halfback. After graduating in 1950, he was drafted by Cleveland Browns. He signed, in 1950, with the National League team and played with Cleveland for four seasons. In 1954 he was persuaded to sign with the Saskatchewan Roughriders, and the Browns' loss was Saskatchewan's gain.

With the Riders, Ken performed brilliantly as a runner, pass receiver and defensive halfback. In 1955 he won the league scoring championship, and was named the most valuable player in the league.

Always a favorite with players and fans alike, Ken's appointment as Head Coach was well received. Undaunted by his lack of coaching experience, Ken hopes to duplicate the performance of Bud Grant, who so successfully moved from player to coach of the Winnipeg Club.

Carpenter is married and the father of two children. His family has resided in Regina for the past four years.



BOB MADDOCK

Assistant Coach

A native of Santa Ana, California, Bob played college ball at the University of Notre Dame, graduating in 1942. He played with the Chicago Cardinals in 1942, served in the navy as a lieutenant (JG) from 1943-45, and returned to the Cardinals in 1946.

In 1947 Bob turned to coaching with the University of San Francisco. He spent 1948 as line coach with the Chicago Rockets and then moved to the University of Indiana for five years, and the University of Missouri for three years as line coach.

In 1958 Bob joined the Roughrider coaching staff. He has proved himself an excellent instructor in the techniques of line play. The announcement that he would return again in 1960 was popular with the players and the many friends Bob has made in Regina the past two seasons.



LEN YOUNCE

Assistant Coach



Len played college football at Oregon State from 1937-41 and was named All-American in his senior year. After graduating from university, he joined the New York Giants in 1941 and remained until 1948. He was named All Pro Guard in each of the seasons 1944, '46 and '47. He has been named All-Time All-Pro Guard, and captained the Giant club in 1947 and '48.

In 1949 he returned to Oregon State as line coach and served in that capacity until 1955. During that time, as defensive coach, the Beavers became known as an extremely strong defensive team. Since 1955 Younce has been officiating in the Pacific Coast Conference, and working as a salesman in the industrial equipment field.

Younce is married, with three boys and two girls, ranging in age from 3-15 years. Carpenter was pleased to acquire Len as one of his assistants.

RON ABRAM—27, 6'1", 195 lbs., Offensive Quarterback, Defensive Halfback. Born quarterbacked Saskatchewan Hilltops in Dominion Junior Championship in 1946. For six years with the Roughriders, Ron has played mostly as a defensive halfback. In 1955, when Tripucha was hurt, he quarterbacked the Roughriders to a win over the Dominion Champions, Winnipeg Blue Bombers. Ron is rated a good passing and running quarterback.



DON ALLARD—24, 6', 180 lbs., Offensive Quarterback, Defensive Halfback. After an outstanding football career at Boston College, Don was number one draft choice of the Washington Redskins in 1948. He signed a 1949 contract with Ottawa, but was traded to Saskatchewan in late August. Though injured part of the last season, Allard demonstrated good all around ability, and could develop into one of the best quarterbacks in Canada. Married, his home town is Somerville, Massachusetts.



PAUL ANDERSON—27, 6'5", 200 lbs., Offensive End, Defensive End. Paul played junior football with Saskatchewan Hilltops and first joined the Riders in 1951. Exclusively played as an offensive tackle but Paul did play end in junior ball and has good hands and speed. Married and a permanent resident of Regina.



RAY ASH—23, 5'10", 210 lbs., Offensive Guard and Centre, Defensive Tackle. Ray is a graduate of the Winnipeg Junior Reds, was won the Canadian Champions in 1950, and finished in 1952. In 1954 he played for the Regina Golden Bears. He was chosen All-Star junior guard in Man-Sask. Junior League in 1957. In 1958 he received the Canadian Rookie of the Year award with the Regina Golden Bears. He joined the Roughriders in 1959. Married, Ray makes his home in Regina.



RON ATCHISON—30, 6'7", 220 lbs., Offensive Guard, Defensive Guard. This will be Ron's ninth year with the Roughriders, after graduating from the Saskatchewan Hilltops. He is a terrific leader, and is rated one of the top middle guards in the Western Conference. Playing in the Rugby game in 1955, he was named by the W.P.U. Offensive All-Star team in 1956. In 1958 also received the Mack Thoms trophy as the most valuable Canadian on the Roughriders squad. Married, and a permanent resident of Regina.



DANNY BAMBA—22, 5'9", 155 lbs., Offensive Halfback, Defensive Halfback. A former Regina Junior Red who joined the Roughriders in 1955 when he still had one year of junior eligibility left. Though small in size, Danny is an excellent tackle and has good reaction on defense. He was runner-up for Canadian Rookie of the Year in 1958. Danny is single.



DON BEATTIE—25, 6'11", 230 lbs., Offensive Halfback, Defensive Halfback. Played last three years with London Lords, where he won the trophy as most valuable Canadian in the O.C.F.U. in 1956. Rated good offensive back with power, speed and pass-catching ability. Home town—London. Don is single.



CLAIR BRANCH—22, 6'1", 207 lbs., Offensive Fullback, Defensive Linebacker. From the University of Texas, Branch is a muscular player with a reputation as a great blocker and defensive linebacker. Last fall he gained prominence as a full carrier. His performance against S.M.U. earned a nomination as the Nation's "Back-of-the-Week." Branch played under Darrel Royal, former Edmonton Coach. Branch is single and calls Kennedy, Texas, his home town.



FRED HURRY—26, 6', 205 lbs., Offensive Fullback, Defensive Corner Linebacker. From Southwestern Oklahoma University, Fred was drafted by the Baltimore Colts in 1956. He was one of their last backfield cuts and joined the Roughriders squad for their last two games. He established himself as a hard-hitting fullback and scored five T.D.'s in the final game against Winnipeg. Fred's home town is San Antonio, Texas. He was married in January of 1959.



DANNY CLARKE—22, 6'4", 205 lbs., Offensive Tackle, Defensive Tackle. A graduate of the Regina Junior Reds, now in his tenth year with the Riders, Dan has been a regular defensive tackle for the past four years, and is rated as one of the outstanding Canadian defensive linemen in the league. In 1952 he was named the most valuable Canadian with the Roughriders. Dan is also noted as an outstanding carrier and is a regular contributor in the Saskatchewan Bear playdowns. Dan is married with two children.



BUD CURRAN—22, 6', 175 lbs., Offensive Halfback, Defensive Halfback. A graduate of the 1958 Dominion Junior Champion Saskatchewan Hilltops, where he was the leading scorer in Man-Sask Junior League in 1958. Bud joined the Riders in 1959 and showed good speed and reaction, plus terrific delivery. Bud is single and attends the University of Arizona in the off-season.



ALEX BENEFICK—25, 6'1", 240 lbs., Offensive Tackle, Defensive Tackle. After graduating from Syracuse University, Al joined the Roughriders from the COBB of the Philadelphia Eagles in mid-season of 1959. He plays either tackle or guard and possesses good speed for a lineman. Played seven games with the Roughriders and proved to be one of the hardest hitting tacklers in the league. Two good tackles resulted in fumbles and touchdowns for the Roughriders squad. His home is in Bristol, Connecticut.

TERRY HUNTING—25, 6', 225 lbs., Offensive Guard, Defensive End. A native of Port Arthur when he played intermediate football with the Port Arthur Mustangs, and was a pecunia All-Star in the Lakehead league. Married, home town is Port Arthur.



BILL CURRAN—22, 6', 220 lbs., Offensive Guard, Defensive Linebacker. Last year, in his senior year with Illinois, Bill was named All-Star in the Big Ten Conference, made practically every All-American team named, and was the football writer's choice for the Golden Trophy as the best lineman in the nation. Drafted fifth by Chicago Cardinals. Played in the Copper Bowl and Optimist Bowl games. Married, his home town is Channahon, Illinois.

LARRY STUMMIE—23, 5'10", 180 lbs., Offensive Halfback, Defensive Safety. He played with Regina Junior Bums in 1955 and 1956. For the past three seasons he has attended the University of Arizona. He was the fastest man on the varsity team in 1956, and in 1957 gained prominence as safety man on their defensive squad. Single, his home town is Fir Mountain, Wash.



RON DUMAS—25, 6'7", 212 lbs., Offensive End, Defensive Corner Linebacker. A former Regina Red Junior, now in his fifth season with the Riders. Ron has been a regular offensive end for the past three years. Ron was the top Canadian pass-catcher in the league in 1958, catching 23 out of 30 passes thrown. Ron is married, with two children.

FRANK FLEGER—25, 6' 3/4", 200 lbs., Offensive Halfback, Defensive Safety. Frank was acquired from Ottawa in the deal for Frank Tripucka. He started his football career at Montreal High School, and later obtained a scholarship at Tennessee State University. Frank was sold by Montreal to Ottawa Roughriders, where he played for three years. He has good speed and is equally valuable on offense or defense. A motivational element, Frank is still single.



BOB GOLIO—26, 6'3", 242 lbs., Offensive Tackle, Defensive Tackle. Bob joined the Roughriders in 1956. He was rated the best tackle in football camp but suffered a broken arm in the exhibition game against Ottawa in 1956. Bob played with Indiana University in 1954 and 1955. In 1956 he joined the Montreal Alouettes and in 1957 was traded to the Hamilton Ti-Cats. He is a hard worker and excellent team man. His home is in Willowick, Ohio.

JACK GOYTA—25, 6'4", 210 lbs., Offensive End, Defensive Halfback. Jack played with Oregon State in 1950-51, and 1952. He played Service ball with Hamilton Air Force where he was an All-Service end in 1953. In 1956 he was the last cut of the Cleveland Browns. He joined the Calgary Stampede football club and played there for the past two years. In 1957 he was traded to the East-West All-Star Elites team and in 1958 ended in the W.L.F.D. offensive All-Star team. Home town—Tennessee. Withigan Jack is single and a leader in the classroom.



NEIL HAGG—24, 6', 230 lbs., Offensive Centre, Defensive Inside Linebacker. Former centre from Purdue University. Neil joined the Roughriders in 1958, coming from the camp of the Green Bay Packers. He is a versatile player who established himself as a solid linebacker the past two seasons. Neil is married and makes his home in West Lafayette, Indiana.



JIM HEALY—22, 6'11", 220 lbs., Offensive Guard, Defensive Inside Linebacker. A regular at Holy Cross University for three years, Jim captained the 1956 team, and was named All-Eastern Guard. A good blocker on offense and outstanding linebacker, he was rated with the best Holy Cross linemen of all time. He was the 17th draft choice of Washington Redskins. Jim is married and calls his home town Worcester, Massachusetts.



JACK HILL—27, 6', 160 lbs., Offensive Halfback, Defensive Safety. A former Utah State player who was the second highest scorer in U.S. college football in 1956 with 800 points, one short of Syracuse famed Jimmy Brown. Jack is very versatile, being a good runner, pass-catcher, punter, kick-kicker and fine defensive player. In 1958 he won the Dave DeBruin Memorial Trophy in the W.L.F.D. as leading scorer and was chosen to the league's offensive All-Star team. He also represented the West in the annual Shrine game. Jack is a Red team man, and one of the most popular players on the squad. He is married, with two children, and makes his home in Utah in the off-season.



RON KELLY—25, 6'1", 230 lbs., Offensive Fullback, Defensive Linebacker. Ron played junior football at Winnipeg, and moved on to the Blue Bombers in 1955. In 1957 he was traded to Calgary and has been a regular linebacker with that club until acquired by Saskatchewan this year. Married. His home town is Winnipeg.



DOUG KILOW—25, 6'7", 160 lbs., Offensive End, Defensive End. Doug graduated from Boise football at Regina, and has played with the Roughriders for seven years. For a number of years he has been a regular defender end and rated as one of the finest Canadian defensive players in the Roughriders camp. Doug is married and lives in Regina.



EUSE HAINES—25, 6'7", 210 lbs., Offensive Tackle, Defensive Tackle. Haines was named the most valuable lineman in Montreal Intermediates League in 1957. He joined the Roughriders in 1955 and shows promise of becoming a good Canadian lineman. Hain is married and makes his home in Regina.



LEN KING—22, 6', 190 lbs., Offensive Halfback, Defensive Halfback. At the University of Connecticut, in 1957, Len was named by Look Magazine as the best running back in New England. He also led the nation in pass interceptions with 25, and averaged 40 yards as a kicker. Drafted by Washington Redskins, and remained with them for part of 1958 season, when he quit the squad to complete his degree at Connecticut. He sat out Washington's option in 1959 and played semi-pro ball in Massachusetts. Highly recommended by former Washington coach, Joe Kuharich. Married, his hometown is Waterbury, Connecticut.

BOB KOCH—23, 6'2", 230 lbs., Offensive Guard, Defensive Lineman. Bob joined the Saskatchewan Roughriders last season, a late cut from the Detroit Lions. While at the University of North Carolina, he was All-State and All-American Coast Conference honors in 1958 and received the most valuable lineman award at North Carolina. Bob played in the North-South All-Star game in 1958 and was the second draft choice of the Detroit Lions. He played the last time coming with the Riders in 1959. Bob is married and rails Turvey, Penn., his home town.



BILL LEHMAN—23, 6'1", 220 lbs., Offensive Guard, Defensive Lineman. Bill attended the University of Texas and later transferred to Texas Lutheran College where he has been a guard/linebacker for the past three seasons. In 1957 and 1958 he made the All-Texas All-Star team as a guard, and was chosen as an All-Star on the Lutheran College All-American team. Bill is married and studied Physical Education at college.
