

Queen's, 8; McGill, 4.

Queen's won her first game this season by defeating McGill on Saturday afternoon. The score at the finish was eight to four, and at half time three to nothing in Queen's favor. Despite the fact that the K. A. A. grounds were very soggy and that rain fell during the greater part of the game, a good exhibition of football was given to the three hundred spectators huddled together in the grandstand. In fact it is doubtful if the two crack teams of the Ontario union could play as fine a game under such circumstances. The passing of the wet ball by the quarters was very well done, and the kicking by the halves was a feature. Some very long kicks were made and very few misses made. The players presented a sorry appearance after ten minutes play, and their splashing through mud and water made the spectators shiver. It was a fair win for Queen's for McGill at no time was dangerous. Queen's wings followed up better than their opponents, and their scrummages also did better work. No one was ruled off and no one was injured. The delays throughout the whole game only amounted to ten minutes. The teams were:

McGill—back, McDougall; halves, Glasco, Savage, Johnston; quarters, Young; scrummage, King, McLay, O'Brien; wings, Beck, Cowen, Percy, Trihey, Shillington, Moleon, Duffy.

Queen's—back, McDonald; halves, Scott, Walkem, Elliott; quarter, McDowall; scrummage, F. Carr-Harris, Russell, Young; wings, B. Carr-Harris, Devitt, Sheriff, Etherington, Macdonald, J. Young, Williams.

Referee—A. Mackenzie, 'Varsity; umpire, cadet W. Harty, R. M. C.; timers, Dr. Clarke and C. Y. Ford, Kingston.

Although McGill had the wind in the first half, it was Queen's game from start to finish. The first fifteen minutes were taken up by scrimmaging until Scott kicked the ball to McGill's 10 yard line. On a free kick to Queen's, Elliott kicked over the line and McDougall roused. Queen's 1, McGill 0.

McGill worked the ball up to Queen's twenty yard line, but by clever work Queen's gradually made gains to the extent of fifty yards. Scott received the ball from a pass by McDowall and kicked into touch ten yards from McGill's goal. After some scrimmages Savage got the ball but was tackled by Walkem, and a touch-in goal for Queen's was the result. Queen's 2, McGill 0. After the kick off, the halves did some kicking until the ball was scrimmaged fifteen yards from McGill's goal. J. Young received the ball from a pass, and ran into touch-in goal. Queen's 3, McGill 0. During the remaining ten minutes of the half no scoring was done, both teams being on equal terms.

One minute of the second half had not been played when Scott and Walkem missed a fly kick. The ball was kicked slightly by a McGill wing and taken out of their reach. Duffy had no trouble in picking the ball up and trotting over Queen's line for a try. The goal was not converted. Queen's, 3; McGill, 4. During the rest of the second half Queen's had the decided advantage, although McGill at times fought stubbornly. Queen's worked the play close to McGill's goal line, but McDowall became too anxious to score and picked the ball out of the scrummage. McGill got a free kick, but gained little.

A free kick for Queen's followed but Johnston returned from behind his goal to five yards in front and outside. Young picked the ball out of the scrummage and Queen's secured another free kick, Elliott sending the ball far over McGill's line, and forcing McDougall to rouse. Queen's 4, McGill 4.

Six minutes remained to be played, but two had not elapsed when Elliott again kicked over McGill's line and Scott secured a try, which was not converted. Queen's 5, McGill 4. When time was called the play was a few feet from McGill's goal.
