

OTTAWA DOWNED GRANITES.

OTTAWA, October 22.—The Ottawa football team defeated the Granites of Kingston here on Saturday by a score of 33 points to 7. It was the Ottawa's easiest victory this season. The game was very clean. Not only was there not a man on either side ruled off, but the referee did not have to warn any of the players for rough work. Very little off-side playing was seen and few penalties given. The play was hard and steady, and on a couple of occasions there were somewhat brilliant features in the way of long runs by the Ottawa men. The Ottawa back division showed a big improvement over their work in previous games, especially being sure in their catching. The wings were fast. At half time the score stood 15 to 0 for the Ottawas. In the next half the Ottawa tallied up 18 points more, and the Granites got 7.
