

GRANITES WON.

Kingston, Oct. 27.—Granites won from Argonauts today by 9 to 7. It was a hot game and a great crowd enjoyed the engagement. Both teams played with energy, for much depended upon the result. The teams facing each other at 3 p.m. were: Granites—Full-back, McDonald; halves, McConville, Elliott and Hamilton; quarter, McDowall; scrumage, Milo, Lumb and Moore; wings, Kingsley, Young, Varney, J. Elliott, Tobin and Palmer. Argonauts—Full-back, Ardagh; halves, Hardisty, Darling, Gleason; quarter, Morrison; scrumage, Wright, Russell and Boyd; wings, Hill, Ansley, Ripley, Crawford, Love Haverson and Chadwick.

Robert Mullen, Toronto, refereed, and Robert Sproat, Toronto, was umpire. Objection was made to the predominance of Toronto officials and one was retired from touch line for holding a bet. Three Granites were ruled off for rough play, but no objection was heard to the Argonauts' work. In the first half the ball was much in Granites' territory. Chaucer Elliott scored the first touch. The goal judge awarded the kick but Referee Mullen reversed the decision. Score, Granites, 4; Argonauts, 0.

Granites put up a good defence, but Argonauts walked out two touches-in-goal. Then the ball was worked up to Granites' goal and Kingsley secured a touch but it was not converted; later Granites roused and the score at half-time was Granites, 8; Argonauts, 3.

In the second half the Granites had the ball much of the time in Argonauts' territory. After a scrumage, Darling got the ball and sprinted well, securing a touch. He made a miss of the kick, and the Argonauts ended their score with 7 points. Granites made a touch-in-goal before the game ended. Final score, Granites, 9; Argonauts, 7.
