Toronto Made Good Against Argos.

Toronto, Nov. 12.—The Torontos downed the Argonauts in the senior O. R. F. U. match this afternoon before the second largest crowd at Varsity field this season. The score was 14 to 4 at the finish, and at the half each had scored 4 points. The weather was not the best possible for football, as a stiff wind blew northeast. Argonauts kicked north, with the wind aiding them. It was in the first half that Argo's lost the game. They did not play a kicking game, but held the ball for runs. Argonauts played a rough, hard game and five minutes after the opening Brockbank had his leg accidentally broken by a kick. Mara took his place on the wing line, Brockbank remained on the field and watched the game out. Robertson had his ankle badly sprained; he continued playing, however, and made some good bucks and runs. Argonauts seemed determined to win in any kind of way. Morrison was again the star player of the game; he was heady in his plays and used good judgment in his kicks. The Argos' backs did not use good judgment in their kicks. Argonauts were outplayed, and the Torontos were speedier and headier. In the second half the ball at the start went at once to Argonauts' end and stayed there practically for the rest of the game.
