

**MONTREAL LOST
TO THE TIGERS**

**Hamilton Bunch Look Good to Land the
Dominion Championship.**

**Captured the First Round in a Hard Struggle. Tope
Had His Leg Broken. Record Crowd in
Attendance.**

Hamilton, Nov. 19.—The largest crowd of the year witnessed the Dominion championship game Saturday. The west side of the grounds was a sea of mud, and it happened to be Montreal's luck to have this for the first half. The Rooters' Club was out in force and made themselves heard. Russell took Stinson's place on Montreal's back line.

By a score of 11 to 6, Hamilton Tigers, champions of the O. R. F. U., defeated Montreal winners of the Quebec Union, in the semi-finals for the Dominion championship. The Tigers will now meet the winners of the intercollegiate in Toronto in final game. Tigers won on their merits. They out-kicked and out-tackled the easterners; in fact, the tackling of Montreal was the worst here in years. There was a lot of scrapping on the lines that escaped the officials, and many a knee and elbow was handed out to the unfortunates who had the ball.

Tigers played under a handicap after the first quarter.

Tope, their star fullback, had his leg broken just at quarter-time, and Harrison, who took his place, while relieving brilliantly at times, could not be relied upon. Craig, at centre half for Montreal, put up a hard game, but was given little opportunity to make any of his dazzling runs. The same can be said about Moore of the Tigers. About ten thousand witnessed the game.
