

## HAMILTON ALERTS SWAMP ST. MICHAELS

### Mayor Lees of Hamilton Instructs Police to Stop Game If Any Roughness Is Seen

HAMILTON, Oct. 30.—The Alerts overwhelmed St. Michaels in the senior O.R.F.U. fixture, winning by a score of 52 to 2. It was an easy game for the home team, as the two Gonters were the only members of the visiting team who showed any form. They punted and caught well, but were unable to stem the tide unassisted. The heavy Alert line mowed down the collegians, and they made gains almost at will.

Only in the third quarter did St. Michaels show any form, but the best they could accomplish was two rouges on long kicks by Dutch Gonter. The Alerts scored 17 points in the first quarter, 15 in the second, and 20 in the fourth.
