Hamilton Rowing Club Was Beaten

HAMILTON, Nov. 7.— Big Four history was repeated here to-day in the senior O.R.F.U. series, when T. R. and A.A., like the Argos, after being defeated at home took their Hamilton opponents into camp in a strenuous game of rugby, by the score of 16 to 12. Hamilton Rowing Club only needed to win this game to land the O.R.F.U. championship, and with Ross Craig, the great line plunger available, their chances were

considered 2 to 1 betting by their supporters, but T.R. and A.A. outplayed them at every angle, and led from start to finish, the visitors scoring a try in the first three minutes of play, and leading at quarter time by 6 to 3, and at half time by 6 to 5. In the third period they ran up ten more points and should have been credited with five more, but bad guesswork on the part of the officials robbed them of a sure try. The locals were held scoreless in the third period but in the closing quarter tallied seven points on a field goal and two safety touches.

The game was played on a perfect rugby field, the ground being hard and dry, but a slight and tricky breeze favored the team kicking up hill. Many brilliant plays were pulled off by both teams, the running of McKelvie pulling the Rowing Club out of many tight corners, and shifting the play to T.R. and A.A. territory, while the kicking of Hal DeGruchy for T.R. and A.A. was his best effort of the season, his kicks suiting his wings to perfection. He mixed them up to good effect also, and on three or four occasions booted over the Rowing Club backs, thus getting long gains for his team.
