

TORONTOS WIN ONTARIO RUGBY CHAMPIONSHIP

**Rough Stuff Features
Game Between the Two
Rowing Clubs.**

REAL SOCIABLE TIME

**Spectators and Players
Share in Several Free-
for-All Scraps.**

Hamilton, Ont., Nov. 14. — Toronto Rowing and Athletic Association became champions of the Ontario Rugby football union yesterday afternoon when in the second game of the home and home play-off with Hamilton Rowing Club, in a rough display of football, the best Hamilton could do was to run up 18 points against the Toronto club's 10. Toronto's had a lead of 23 points from the first game, staged in Toronto a week ago, and won out in the series by a 14 point margin.

Both teams participated in rough house tactics. The crowd, taking their cue from the players, also became rough and several fights occurred between the Toronto supporters and the local followers.

Trouble started at the outset when the Hamilton Rowing club officials refused to take the field with Lou Marsh as umpire. The crowd did not take kindly to De Gruchy, of the Toronto's, and urged the players to "get him." This they apparently tried to do, as the officials were often forced to pull the opposing tackles from him after he had been downed.
