

Despite Inclement Weather Varsity Will be Here Today to Play Joe Price's Team

Will Be Deciding Contest of Alberta "Big Four" Rugby Union; Game Will Be Staged at Hillhurst Park, Starting at 3 o'Clock; Edmonton Appears Confident of Upsetting the Dope

Backed by many rooters, the University of Alberta rugby football team of Edmonton will come to Calgary today to play the Canucks in an Alberta Big Four union game. Upon the result of this contest hinges the provincial championship and the right to play off for the western Canada title against Regina on Saturday, November 15.

"All Set" is the word coming from both camps. The heavy training ceased yesterday, the scrimmage is over, the players are resting, ready for the fray.

Varsity is coming down dead set on upsetting the dope. They are figuring on their able line plunging, this being their only advantage in the game they lost to Canucks at Edmonton. The Canucks displayed superior team work as well as superior brains, their back field being much stronger than their opponents, while their tackling was better.

So far this season Calgary Canucks have played three games, defeating Varsity and taking the local Tigers into camp twice. Varsity have played but two games, breaking even. They still have a chance to cop the provincial honors, but in order to do so will have to win today. The game will be played at Hillhurst park, starting, at 3 o'clock sharp.

The parks department plowed the snow off the field yesterday and also cleaned up the grandstand and bleachers, so that conditions will not be as severe as expected, especially now that the weather has moderated. It takes quite a lot to keep the real ardent fan away from a rugby match and with the championship within the grasp of the Canucks there should be a big turnout this afternoon.

Edmonton Varsity will have among its players many Calgary boys who learned the game in the local schools. Among them will be "Big Six" Langford, Dier, Palmer, Baker, Beatty and Webster. The students can be styled as inexperienced players but they possess all the natural qualities to produce players and that they have become experts may be shown this afternoon.

Canucks will play practically the same lineup which recently gave the local Tigers their setback. The only change will be that Fullerton will be one of the halves, while Gibson will move up on the line. Coach Joe Price is counting on his wonderful halves to decide the issue. The punting of Fraser and McTeer and the bucking and running of Fraser and McLaws will play a prominent part in Canucks' favor. The visitors look to Beatty and Langford to be the shining lights for their side. After the game the rah-rah boys will be entertained to a dance at the Regent hall.
