

WESTMINSTER GIVES VICTORIA BATTLE

Capitals Triumph 19-5 In Big Four Rugby Tilt.

VICTORIA, Nov. 3.—Victoria wound up its home stand in the "Big Four" Canadian Rugby League on Saturday afternoon by defeating the New Westminster Royals 19-5. The game was extremely close until the second half was well under way when Victoria switched from trying to run the ends and bucked the line instead.

At half time the score stood 6-5 in favor of the Capitals. Each side scored a touchdown, but Victoria added a rouge which gave them the extra point. Skillings made a beautiful run to touch down for Victoria while "Boo" Bourne plunged through for the only touch the Royals obtained.

In the second half Victoria fed the ball a great deal to the aggressive Jack McDonald who plunged through the Westminster line for great gains. After Victoria had forced a rouge McDonald was successful in hurling himself over the line for a touchdown, which made the score 12-5 in favor of the Capitals.

The last try of the game was scored by Joe McAllister, who plunged through the middle for ten yards to ground the ball. The extra point was added on the kick.

The game wound up the Canadian rugby season here unless the Regina Rough Riders complete arrangements for a tour of the Coast and stage a game here.
