CAPITALS OUTPLAY WESTMINSTER SQUAD

Jack D'Easum Stars But Gets Poor Support and Royals Lose, 16-3.

NEW WESTMINSTER, Oct. 13.—Victoria showed their superiority over New Westminster in a Big Four rugby game played at Queens Park this afternoon, when the Capitals registered 16 points to the Royals 3.
