

Varsity Again Wins The Big Four Series

Collegians Maintain Unbeaten Record In Senior Canadian Rugby.

WENTWORTH STARS

Royals, Though Defeated, Fight Uphill Battle Throughout.

NEW WESTMINSTER, Oct. 27. —Varsity maintained its unbroken record of victories in the Big Four Canadian rugby series when the Blue and Gold twelve defeated the Royals by a score of 22 points to 1. The lone point surprised the spectators three minutes after the commencement of the game when the Royals scored on a rouge. From then until half time there was little to it but the Collegians.

In the third quarter New Westminster put up a game battle and held the visitors to a single point, which was gained by a kick to the deadline.

Featuring for Varsity was the play of Charlie Wentworth who kept in the game most of the time. Wentworth's plunges were brilliant and he accepted lots of punishment in making yardage. Shields was also in fine form on the defense. His punting was high and far—high enough to have his wings easily up under them.

Following the temporary set-back, Varsity buckled down to its game and it was left to Wentworth to make a forty-yard run up the field to the five-yard line. The ball went over on the play but conversion failed.

SHIELDS' BOOTING TELLS.

In the second quarter, Shields scored three points on a field kick while Jackson sent his team further ahead with a line plunge.

Dixon scored a touchdown after a fifty-yard run while Varsity scored another point on a kick to the deadline before the half-time whistle sounded. The score then read 19 points to 1.

Some splendid tackling by Gifford and d'Easum, line plunges by Don Goldie and some clever end work by Purvis featured the third quarter when the Royals showed their best form of the season. The Varsity line was in danger on two occasions but the college boys banded themselves together to stop the less-experienced Royals. Wentworth starred in this quarter but more than met his match in Gifford and d'Easum, who tackled low and sure.

Purvis raised the hopes of the Royals in the fourth quarter when he made an end run of thirty yards after two deadline kicks had sent the score to 22 points for Varsity. Trouble was averted when Shields sailed out a long high punt which the Royals fumbled.
