

U.B.C. WINS AT VICTORIA

Islanders Show Big Improvement and Extend Champs to Limit

VICTORIA, Oct. 21.—The University of British Columbia Canadian rugby team just managed to nose out a vastly improved Victoria U.C.T. team by a 14 to 12 count in a sensational grid struggle at the Royal Athletic park on Saturday before one of the largest crowds of the season.

Varsity lived up to their reputation for invincibility in the first half, taking a lead of 8 to 0. However, in the second half Victoria showed marked superiority over the collegians. Failure by the locals to deliver on one occasion, with the goal only three yards away and with three downs on it, lost them an opportunity for victory.

Varsity's score in the first half came from a touchdown in the first quarter by Grauer and a beautiful drop goal in the second quarter by Shields. The locals tallied a rouge.

In the next half Victoria let loose an avalanche of fine plunges and end runs which accounted for two touchdowns and a rouge for a total of 11 points, while they held the collegians to a touchdown and a rouge. Varsity's touch was scored by Wentworth, who was a tower of strength to their side.
