

# TIGERS EARN RIGHT TO MEET QUEEN'S, CRUSHING SARNIA

Held to 1-1 Tie for First Half, Hamilton Breaks Loose to Compile 14-2 Score

## RAY BODWAY SHINES

Makes 50-Yard Dash, and Scores Both Touchdowns as Well — Tiger Outsidest Smother Sarnia Halves

Hamilton, November 17.—Hamilton's famed Tigers pushed and hammered their way to victory over Sarnia Imperials, O.R.F.U. senior champions, here on Saturday afternoon before a crowd of seven thousand fans, by a score of 14 to 2, and qualified to meet Queen's, Intercollegiate Union representatives, in the Eastern Canada final on Saturday next. Tigers really scored fifteen points and many left the grounds satisfied that the Bengals had gained a thirteen-point margin. But in view of the fact that a crowd surged on the field and just behind the goal posts when "Beano" Wright kicked the final counter Referee DeGruchy refused to allow it, claiming that the fans had hindered the Sarnia backs from running the ball out.

The conquerors of Balmy Beach proved troublesome for the first thirty minutes of play, the score at half-time reading one-all, but in the later stages of the game Tigers were much the better. It was offside penalties and fumbles that prevented the Tigers from compiling a score in the first half. They broke the Sarnia line almost at will, but a ten-yard gain usually brought a fifteen-yard penalty for some infraction of the rules.

Norman Perry, McPhedran and Stirling were stopped all afternoon by the deadly tackling of Fear, Simpson and Jimmy Wright. The trio were down the field under every punt from the toe of "Huck" Welch and not once during the entire game did the Sarnia trio pull any of the sensational stuff that carried them to victory in their own group and enabled them to down Balmy Beach in the mud on Monday last by a 3 to 0 count.

### TIGERS GET STARTED

In the second half there was no stopping the Jungaleers. They got

the desired break just after play resumed, recovering a fumbled ball near midfield, and from then on the tilt had a distinct Tiger flavor. They started their march from there and the Imperials, although using their entire strength in an effort to stave off defeat, failed miserably, and Boadway with a fifty-yard jaunt put Tigers in position for a major score and the champions made no mistake. Boadway himself carried the ball across on the second down, plunging right through the centre of the goal posts. Some ten minutes later, and just after the teams had changed ends for the final quarter, he repeated the performance, ploughing through the centre of the Sarnia line for a ten-yard gain and another major score.

Tigers, although aided by a strong wind in the opening quarter, only scored one point. Time and again they were in scoring position, but fumbles and offences cost them chances and the teams changed ends with Sarnia in possession on their own fifteen-yard line.

For the first ten minutes of the period Tigers gave an exhibition of defensive strength by holding the Imperials in their own end of the field. But two fumbles in a row put Sarnia within scoring distance and Stirling booted over for the tying counter.

In the third session Tigers added six points, a deadline point and a try, while Sarnia had to be satisfied with a single counter and the change for the final quarter was made with Tigers leading 7 to 2. In that last quarter the Imperials never got a chance to shine. They were helpless against the heavier opposing line, while their backs were held in check by the Tiger outsidest. Tigers forced them back and scored a touch and three single points, one of which was disallowed, while playing against the wind.
