Varsity Orphans Fall by Wayside

Noe Jubenville's Work in Final Quarter Brings Victory To Locals In First Senior O. K. F. U. Struggle

A SOARING punt that travelled 70 yards, a fumble by the opposition on their own 10-yard line, two mast thrusts by the home team that netted eight yards, a spectacular sprint by Noe Jubenville that resulted in a touchdown—all late in the fourth quarter—and Windsor had celebrated its bow in senior Ontario Football Union ranks with a surprising 11-7 victory over Toronto Varsity Orphans at the new Kennedy College Stadium Saturday afternoon. Fifteen hundred fans, a good turnout considering the counter-attraction at Walker Airport, were on hand to assist in the official welcome of senior Canadian football to the Border Cities.
