Deacon White, popular coach, will turn over his band of Edmonton Eskimos against the Calgary Tigers at Hillhurst park this afternoon, in the local opening of the Alberta Rugby Union 1930 gridiron season. Play will commence at 3 o'clock, with Walter Ross, of Calgary, and Bill Broadfoot, of Edmonton, officiating. These officials have been appointed for the entire schedule by President Moe Lieberman. Both teams have had the advantage of two games, Eskimos having lost an exhibition contest to Hamilton Tigers 1 to 21 and defeating University of Alberta 18-0 in a league affair. Tigers defeated Moose Jaw 12-0 in an Exhibition and were on the short end of a 37-8 score with Hamilton.



One Real Find
One outstanding performer has been added to the intrepid squad since last season, in the person of Shuttleworth, formerly of the Hamilton Tigers, who in the game against Varsity tossed several accurate forward passes, mainly to Williamson for big gains. Ken McConnell, who will rival any of the Hamilton Tigers for size and weight is a newcomer on the line, although he has been a resident of Edmonton for many years. Jones, drop kicker, extraordinary; Runge, Duggan, Carver, Williamson, Richards and Ketter were regulars of last fall. Richards learned his rugby while attending school in Calgary.

The Eskimos have plenty of weight and an abundance of speed. If they function smoothly in their plays they will provide worthy opposition. Deacon White has always been a strong believer in line plunging, and having seen Hamilton Tigers feature this play with success, it is probable that his front line stalwarts will be in there smashing away at the Tiger's first line defence this afternoon.

Tigers will be without Fritz Sandstrom, quarter, and Donnie Ware, flying wing, both of whom were injured in the game last Wednesday. Cee McKinnon will move from the

backfield to quarter, a position he handled last season after Sandstrom was hurt. Harrison will play the Flying Wing position, and being a fast runner should fit in well on the extended runs.

Back in Action
Ralph Johnston, who played so well against Moose Jaw, but was unable to perform against Hamilton will be back in action on the back field. There is a probability that Ellis, who shaped up so well Wednesday may start as a regular lineman. Hess has recovered from his slight injury and will be shooting the ball higher and farther. His punting is likely to prove the turning point in the game. The balance of the players came through the Hamilton game in first class condition and are ready to uphold the reputation established by the team last fall.

Despite the fact that they will be minus their field general and another capable player, the Tigers are hopeful of inaugurating the season successfully. Eskimos are equally confident, so the game should be well worth witnessing.

Juniors Play Too.
By some queer quirk of the schedule makers, North Side and South Calgary Juniors meet for the second time in succession, when they clash in the third game of the local junior league season, as a preliminary to the Tigers-Eskimos contest. South surprised the Hillhurst squad in their initial meeting a week ago, but Coach Cameron's outfit will be out today to reverse the verdict.

Encouraged by their opening victory, the South Siders have put in a week of steady practice, with enthusiasm evident in the number of players turning out.

The contest will start at 1:45 o'clock in order to get the game completed before the Seniors take the field.
