

Varsity Beaten By the Mustangs

Western Outplayed Blue and
White to Take Final
Game, 9 to 2

LONDON, Nov. 17.— Western Mustangs effectually cleared up the tangle in the Intercollegiate here Saturday, when they trimmed Varsity 9 to 2. Joe Breen's team was as much the better team as the score shows. Varsity's defeat was due to the fact that their line failed to give Sinclair protection for his punting and the result was four blocked kicks.

In addition to this, young Brown, who substituted for Paterson, the crippled Western kicker, showed unexpected class.

In the last period Varsity went to pieces badly and Western walked over them, finally clinching the game when, after a series of Varsity misplays, Stull's try was paved by a mix-up in signals on the Varsity team which let the ball be snapped to unoccupied territory.

Brown was the outstanding player on the winning team. In the first period his kicking was weak, but from then on he gathered confidence and booted continually as well as Varsity's star, Jack Sinclair. Sinclair was hampered by weak protection and was forced to kick hurriedly practically all afternoon. Four of his punts were blocked, and it is a mystery that more of them did not go astray. Brown's principal support came from Kennedy, who was playing as flying wing, the two Valerjotes, both of whom bucked and tackled well, Gugino, Tweedie and Dean, all of whom made big gains plunging the line, and Stull and Jewel, who tackled nicely. Jack Sinclair and Billy Bell caught faultlessly in the Varsity back field, but were not given much chance to get started on their runs. Johnny Fitzpatrick, Jim Sinclair, Gooderham and Ruddell also turned in good games. Ruddell was the best man Varsity had on a weak wing line.
