

SENIOR GRID TEAMS PLAY HERE TODAY

Eskimos Oppose Varsity In Game Billed At Renfrew Park

A fighting, re-vamped Eskimo team and a flashing band from the University of Alberta will clash at Renfrew Park this afternoon in the feature game of the local Canadian football season. This highlight of the fall campaign is scheduled to get underway at 2:30 o'clock sharp.

The great interest shown in the "big game" by Edmonton fans and students at the University has indicated that a record attendance, for this year at least, will be on hand when the kick-off takes place.

Both squads are declared in the pink of condition for the contest and one of the most sternly-waged grid-iron battles of the year is looked for when these rivals of long standing meet for the first time during the current campaign.

RIVALRY APLFT

Former team mates will, in a few cases, be opposed to one another in this afternoon's football spectacle at the park below the big hill and this will not by any means serve to lessen the bitter feeling that has always existed between the Varsity and Eskimo teams in the past.

Each club is out to win at all costs as it may be their only meeting of the 1931 season and each is anxious to claim the title of city champions.

Coach Morgan wound up the students' training by putting them through a light work-out at Varsity Stadium yesterday and he hopes for a triumph over the big Blue and White team in today's game.

SKULL PRACTICE

The Eskimos did not go through a work-out but Coach Cliff Shuttleworth held a skull practice in the team's training quarters at the Alberta hotel. There is plenty of confidence in the Igloo-dwellers camp and the players expect to register their first win of the season in this contest.

The Blubber-Eaters will face the students with a somewhat different line-up than was sent against Calgary in their last two starts. "Bud" Williamson has been moved from outside wing to the backfield, where he will throw the forward passes, while George Mathieson, flying wing, moves out to the end position vacated by "Bud." Clayton Dolighan will start as a regular in the back division and will handle the punting assignment.

Both coaches have announced that their offensives will be featured by a liberal use of the forward pass and running plays and it is thought that a brilliant, wide-open battle will result.

Moe Lieberman will referee the game, with Bill Broadfoot as judge of play and Jimmy Enright as head linesman.
