

# Mustangs Pass Varsity Under

**Western U. Team Takes  
Second Place in Inter-  
collegiate With 6-4 Win.**

TORONTO, Oct. 25.—Turning a seemingly-certain defeat into a spectacular victory, University of Western Ontario defeated University of Toronto, 6-4, here Saturday in an Intercollegiate Rugby Union game, which just about eliminated Varsity from titular contention.

Held in check for almost the entire game by a stubborn Varsity line, and laboring under the handicap of four points scored by the mighty boot of Jack Sinclair, the Mustangs unleashed a forward pass in the last minutes of the final quarter that changed the complexion of the game.

## Thrilling Finish.

In possession on their own twenty-five-yard line, Western sprang their unexpected play. Ward tossed a long forward pass, Kennedy receiving it and galloping deep into Varsity territory. As he was tackled, he passed to Brown, who romped the rest of the way for a touchdown. Patterson converted the touch for the extra point.

It was a thrilling climax to a game that hitherto had been ordinary. On the rain-soaked grid, the footing was treacherous and the greasy ball caused frequent fumbles, none of which, however, played a part in the scoring.

The delighted Mustangs turned somersaults in their hilarity for the win put Western in second place in the championship race.

In an exhibition tilt played as the opener of the double bill, Sarnia Imperials downed the Varsity Orfuns, 9-2, in a game which saw fumbles play an important part in the scoring.
