**HAMILTON, Ont., Oct. 26.**—After adding a touchdown on two plays and adding the extra point to establish a 6-0 lead in the first two minutes of Saturday's important senior O.R.F.U. group game at H.A.A.A. Hamilton added its eighth point early in the third quarter when Tierney lifted one of his long, left-footed punts to the deadline. Robson scored for Windsor just before the end of this period when he caught a punt from Tierney and booted it right back to Hamilton's deadline. Tierney booted over the Windsor goal-line in the fourth quarter and Robson was roused for Hamilton's ninth point and the game ended 9-7.

Saturday's game was played on a slippery gridiron that made both running and tackling difficult. Hamilton had a big edge on Windsor in the punting exchanges, both Robson and Hamilton kicking the ball well. Big Jack Tierney, Windsor attacked 21 forward passes, two in the first quarter, two in the second, three in the third and 13 in the fourth. Five of them were completed and two intercepted. Windsor receivers were increased in the second half. Robson entered from Hamilton players, but on only one occasion did the official allow a Greyhound pass as complete for roughing of the catcher, despite loud protests from the players and

"Mac" Robison, aggressive Windsor middle winger, was injured early in the first quarter and had to be carried from the field. A preliminary examination showed no break, although his right leg was giving him considerable pain. An X-ray Sunday disclosed a clean break.

Greyhounds passed up a golden opportunity to overtake the Tiger Cub in the third quarter at a time when the score stood at 6-6 for the Hamilton Cub. On three plays, Windsor rushed the yard and scored two touchdowns. Robson went through centre for 12 yards to put the ball on Hamilton's five-yard line. Jeffers was tackled on gain. Roster plunged four yards through middle. Windsor's fourth play was blocked by the ball on Hamilton's one-yard line. Windsor touchdown seemed certain but Jeffers was tackling on the third down and he had no room to manoeuvre. The Hamilton tackler was offside, for it was a direct pass to Jeffers from centre and Roly was dived after taking one step. Hamilton kicked and Robson missed.

The game was hard fought throughout, but as close as the final outcome would indicate, but Green Bay's defense never able to get over that costly blocked kick. The Tiger Cubs were rushing Windsor punters all afternoon and McKeown's punt was so good that it forced to hurry his boots continually.
