

Indians Overwhelm 'Varsity 30-Nil In Holiday Rugby Tilt

Score Touchdowns, While Hall Kicks for Five
Exxtra Points in One-sided Game

Shattering the 'Varsity line under a long series of aerial and plunging attacks that netted five touchdowns and a quintet of extra single points, Calgary Altomahs turned back the northern invaders 30-0 in a one-sided game at Mewata Stadium, Monday afternoon, and by virtue of the overwhelming triumph captured senior provincial rugby honors for the 1932 season.

A crowd of more than 2,000 fans watched Altomahs pound their way to the most one-sided victory seen in the Alberta Rugby Union this year. A perfect pitch and occasional splashes of sunshine made conditions ideal for the game and in spite of the ease with which the Indians took the game the fans were treated to some spectacular rugby.

NEW YORK, Oct. 9.—(AP)—Spectacular conference victories for Michigan and Purdue in the midwest and Tulane in the south, and the surprising showings of Chicago, Ohio Wesleyan and Texas in intercollegiate combat, featured the United States intercollegiate football program Saturday.

Tulane, bidding for its second southern conference title in as many years, moved out Georgia, 34-25, after a thrilling battle in which the Georgians routed Tulane's second team.

Chicago, playing Yale in the east for the first time, uncovered a pair of galloping backs in Zimmer and Bahlin, and gained a 7-7 tie with the listless Elis. Otto Wesleyan, expected to be another pushover for Syracuse, refused to roll over and won 19-12 in the east. Texas, supposedly come to strong herself this year, rolled up tremendous 45-0 count on Fresno.
