**VARSITY DEFEATS LETHBRIDGE BY 6-3**

**LETHBRIDGE, Alta., Oct. 9**—(Special)—University of Alberta Golden Bears swooped down on Lethbridge Bulldogs on Saturday afternoon, catching them napping. The final count was 6-3 in

favor of the northerners, despite an early 3-0 lead held by the locals. Teams were very evenly matched, but the play was of a listless variety throughout.

Bloomfield's kicking featured the start and, on a third down, he faked a kick and ran twenty yards. Varsity smeared two Lethbridge ducks, and Bloomfield drop kicked from twenty-five yards for the Bulldogs' only score. The count at the end of the first quarter was 3-0 for Lethbridge.

Varsity started a drive in the second quarter with Malcolm, Rule and Richard carrying the ball. They pulled Lethbridge offside time and again to give them ten-yard penalties.

Richard threw a forward, Morton received and raced over for a touchdown. Varsity's convert was blocked, and the half ended with Varsity leading 5-3.

The third quarter was a listless one, neither team getting anywhere. The score was unchanged. Morton kicked a long one behind the goal line, and Bloomfield was rouged to end the scoring and the game, 6-3, for the visitors.
