

# SARNIA AGAIN ARE CHMPIONS

## Imperials Take Their Sixth Straight Title Beating B. Beach, 11-7

LONDON, Nov. 23. — Sarnia Imperials remained champions of the Ontario Rugby Football Union by virtue of their 11-7 victory over Toronto Balmy Beach in the sudden-death playoff here on Saturday. The Imperials made it six championships in a row when they took the measure of the fighting Beaches.

Sarnia earned their four-point margin on the day's play. They had the edge in what was one of the toughest games ever played on the University of Western Ontario gridiron. Beaches led 3-1 in the first quarter, yielded a touchdown and three other points in the second quarter and gave up two singles in the third. In the last quarter Beaches staged a thrilling offensive, but the best they could do was four points.

Led by Ormond Beach, 240-pound muscle man from the United States, Sarnia were able to get their yards when needed. Beach played one of his greatest games. He was the outstanding player on the field, for without his sterling work Balmy Beach would likely have been crowned champions.

The Balmy Beach attack was nullified continually by sturdy defensive work from the six-times champions, and what gains they made were on short dashes by Moores and some great kicking and forward passing by Ab Box.
