## Louis Chodat Leads Clubbers to Victory

### Varsity Shows Fight in First Half, Which Ends with Score Just 6 to 5

V. A. C. 15, Varsity 5.

V.A.C. Wolves dished out a combination of rugged and ragged football at Athletic Park Saturday to batter Varsity into defeat and perch triumphantly on the top rung of the Big Four Canadian Football ladder.

The red-shirted team used a fast-charging line and smart blocking to shake loose Chodat, Huck and Hicks for gains on the ground.

Their first score came early in the first quarter when Chodat kicked on Varsity's 25-yard line and gathered up the ball again as the college safety-men watched it bound aimlessly around ten yards from their goal line. Then Chodat trundled across for a major score before a couple of tacklers decided it was time to do something.

Varsity's lone score came in the second period, when apRoberts basketballed a pass from the thirty-five-yard line into the waiting arms of Guilet on the ten. Guilet sprinted across standing up, with the whole V.A.C. team left flat-footed. It was the first pass attempt of the game.

Chodat scored again on a thirty-five-yard gain around right end in the third quarter, forward-passing to Read for the extra point. A hard-angle drop kick by Hicks in the last quarter ended the scoring. Vac's other point being gained by Chodat on a first-quarter deadline kick. The winners achieved ten fumbles, but were good enough ballhawks to recover nine of them.

Varsity's defense was demoralized by Wolves' cross-bucks and off-tackle plunges, mixed with several two-man end-runs. Its offense showed strongest on end-runs and forward passes, although high, loping passes were intercepted on three occasions by V. A. C. In Pearson, Doc Burke has uncovered a smart ground-gaining kicker.
