

BALMY BEACH WINS ON LATE RALLY, 9-3

O.R.F.U. Leaders Forced to Come from Behind in Fourth Quarter Against Alerts

Hamilton, Ont., November 10.—(P)
—A spectacular run of more than 50 yards by Manson, smart Toronto Balmy Beach quarterback, paved the way for a 9-3 victory over Eddie McLean's Hamilton Alerts Saturday in the final O.R.F.U. game here of the season.

Before Manson's rare gallop and Drinkwater's plunge for the major count, which Reynolds converted, the Beach crew had just managed to tie the Alerts in the fourth quarter. Hamilton had been leading 3-2 and appeared to be heading for the biggest Eastern Canada football upset of the year.

The first and third quarters went scoreless but in the second frame Southwick was rouged twice for Beach points.

After five minutes of play in the last quarter Alerts started a spectacular march down the field after Walker fumbled on his own 40. The McLean clan moved the ball into a commanding position and Walter Gibb hoofed a field goal to make the score 3-2.

For six or seven minutes Hamilton played defensive football and the crowd of less than 1,000 sat on pins and needles. Then Manson broke away for his lengthy gallop and after two attempts in which Toronto moved forward only slightly, Drinkwater raced across the Alert line for the only major score of the day.

Seymour, the big Beach plunger, Drinkwater, Manson, Walker, Morin, Crowe and Reynolds starred for the winners while best for the losers were the Awrey brothers, Howard and Hardy, and the Gibb brothers, Odie and Walter.
