

Wildcats Mop Up Kitchener Squad

Kitchener, Nov. 10—If there was a communique from the Ontario Rugby Football Union headquarters today it probably would read: "Mopping-up operations completed by Hamilton Wildcats."

The big drive was launched last September and, aside from one slight hitch—a tie game with Toronto Indians—the Wildcats swept all before them, finishing in typical style with a 20-1 victory over Kitchener Panthers here Saturday.

During the six-game schedule, the red, white and blue clad warriors scored 122 points while yielding but 28 to the opposition. A much tougher struggle is in the offing, however, for the next big offensive will be against either Toronto Argos or Ottawa Rough Riders for the East's honors.

Panthers held their powerful rivals to a single point in the first quarter but yielded nine in the second to trail 10-0 at half-time. Wildcats picked up an unconverted touchdown in the third quarter as Panthers were working their way into shooting distance for a single. Another Hamilton touchdown in the final quarter ended the scoring.

George Slinn garnered six of the Wildcats' total, scoring a second quarter touchdown after kicking a single in the first. Walter Gibb booted a field goal from placement and converted Slinn's major. Magee and Fumio accounted for the other Hamilton touchdowns.

A kick to the deadline by Ross Gilbert brought Panthers their lone point.
