## Annis Stukus Snaps Deadlock With Point In Final Quarter

TORONTO, Oct. 31.—(C.P.)—The strain of playing four games in 11 days almost proved fatal to Balmy Beach Saturday, but the Toronto club had just enough left to overcome stiff resistance by Ottawa Combines for a 4-3 verdict which further complicated the three-team duel for Ontario Rugby Football Union play-off positions.

A fourth-quarter placement attempt by Annis Stukus spelled the difference between the teams, the ball rolling to the deadline to break a 3-3 deadlock. The victory, coupled with a 12-8 triumph for Toronto R.C.A.F. Hurricanes over Hamilton Flying Wildcats in the second half of a Varsity Stadium double bill, left Beaches one point behind Hurricanes and Wildcats.

McWatters Kicks Well.

Beaches entered the fray strong favorites to defeat Combines, who have won only one game, but the Ottawa wingline quickly demon-strated its strength and the tired Beaches were forced into a dogged ground duel punctuated by kick-ing exchanges between Ottawa's Arnie McWatters and Jack Pumple, and Sammy Sward of Beaches. Thain Simon crashed the Beach line for lengthy gains in the second half while Stu Scott was Toronto's principal offensive weapon.

Two players monopolized the scoring, Annis Stukus connecting for a placement and deadline single while three singles rolled off the boot of McWatters.
