

Aerial Offensive Gives Navy Win

TORONTO, Oct. 8. — (CP) — A dazzling aerial offensive concentrated in the third quarter gave the Toronto Navy Bulldogs an 11-4 victory over St. Thomas R.C.A.F. Hornets yesterday in an Ontario armed services football league game. It was the third win in three starts for the navy who tightened their hold on first place in the league standing.

Leading Seaman Annis Stukus, the big navy quarterback, pointed the way to victory although the Hornets put a halt to the 12-point scoring clip he set in each of his first two games of the season. Stukus pitched forward passes to OS. M. F. Egan and LS. Tom Waldon for two touchdowns.

The St. Thomas team provided unexpectedly tough opposition for the navy squad and for most of the first half it looked as if they might emerge with their first win of the season.

Their star performer, LAC. Ray (Moon) Mullins, kicked a single point in the first quarter and they dominated the play until the latter part of the second quarter. St. Thomas came through with a two-point safety touch after the two Navy touchdowns and Mullins got the final Air Force point in the last quarter when his attempted placement went to the deadline.
