

Trojans Trounce Indians 31-11 For First O.R.F.U. Victory

TORONTO, Oct. 9.—Ottawa Trojans chalked up five touchdowns, a placement kick and added three more single points on converts to trim Toronto Indians 31-11 at Varsity Stadium, this afternoon for their first triumph of the O.R.F.U. season. Tommy Daley scored two touches to lead Trojans to a comparatively easy victory, with Emile Dagenais, Frank Dunlap and Teddy Edwards going over for one try apiece. George Fraser with a placement and three more points on converts completed the Ottawa scoring.

Passer Put Out.

Although they were only really threatened once in the third-quarter it was a costly enough victory for the Trojans who lost the services of their forward passer, Fern Labrosse. Labrosse suffered a fractured jaw in the first-quarter while carrying the ball on the end of an extension play. The former Ottawa U. star was struck in the face on the tackle by an elbow.

Trojans playing throughout in a driving rain in the second game of a double header, were without Arnie McWatters and Jake Dunlap. McWatters was called to Sarnia after Saturday's game at Hamilton because of the seriousness of his father while Dunlap was rested after being shaken up in the Wildcat struggle.

Dagenais' 53-Yard Touch.

Teddy Edwards handled the team from the quarter back slot and Dagenais who had charge of the kicking duties, started the Trojans off to victory with a 53-yard touchdown dash early in the opening quarter. The former St. Patrick's College star took one of Normie Dyce's punts on the Toronto 33-yard line, sliced through two tacklers and then galloped down field and across the goal-line without a hand being laid on him.

Fraser converted that opening try and Trojans came back in the second-quarter to make it 12-0. Starting from the Indians' 30-yard mark Daley swept to the left on an extension, gained 10 yards and then flipped a lateral pass to Dagenais who raced through to the seven before relaying to Frank Dunlap. Dunlap crossed the goal-line and Fraser converted.

Fraser's Tee Working.

Trojans whipped right back for another three point score in the same quarter with Edwards firing a 20-yard forward to Haigh which placed the ball on the Toronto 50. They promptly barged through for yards on plunges. Dagenais galloped 14 more to the 28 and when the Indians' line stiffened Fraser booted a placement from the 28.

Indians cut loose with forwards just before half time for their first touch starting it with a 34-yard heave over the centre from Harris to King. Trojans blocked a placement try from the 23, but Toronto recovered 14 yards out. Harris promptly threw a forward over the left side which Cummings grabbed near the goal

line. He stepped over as Frank Dunlap lunged at him. The convert was missed.

Indians threw the only scare into the Ottawa camp at the outset of the third quarter when the kick-off was short and fumbled to give Toronto possession on the Trojan 40. A short flicker pass followed and then Brennan cut through to the Ottawa six-yard stripe. Harris promptly forward passed over the goal line to Len Cassidy for a touch and followed up with another forward to Booker for the convert.

Daley Gets His First.

With their margin narrowed to four points Trojans took over again in short order. Dagenais sent a punt to Booker in Toronto territory and the Indians' halfback fumbled it on the run. Chipper picked it up 20 yards out and passed laterally to Leach who was stopped seven yards from the goal line. Daley picked up two more and Dagenais hit the right side for four. Daley then plunged through the right side for a touch and Fraser converted. Trojans grabbed two more touches in the final quarter to finish the scoring. Teddy Edwards picked off an Indian forward pass intended for Cummings on the Toronto 52-yard line and with no one to stop him went the distance for a touch.

Dagenais' placement try missed, and in the last minute with Indians going to the air again deep in their own territory, Daley intercepted a forward on the Toronto 20 and cantered over the line for a touch. Fraser's convert attempt was blocked.
