

OTTAWA TROJANS LOSE TO INDIANS

Toronto Wins ORFU Opener,
19-1, as Stukus
Trio Stars

Ottawa, September 16, — (P) — Toronto Indians, sparked by the veteran Stukus Brothers, coupled first and last quarter splurges Saturday to defeat the youthful Ottawa Trojans 19-1 in the opening game of the Ontario Ruby Football Union season.

The Stukus brothers — Annis, Frank and Bill—were in on practically every Indian scoring play, with Frank and Bill each scoring touchdowns while Annis chalked up three singles. Bob McKelvey, with a touchdown and a convert, accounted for the balance of the Toronto scoring.

Before the quarter ended, Annis Stukus booted a single and then a rouge. A strong westerly wind was behind the Indians during this scoring splurge.

Midway through the third, the Trojans put on their best exhibition, going successively for yards but getting into a scoring position only once. This was when Cummings kicked his single.

Play on the field was closer than the score would indicate, but Indians, with a comfortable lead behind them from almost the opening minutes, were never seriously pressed.

Ottawa was in position for major scores on three occasions, but the best that came of the efforts was one single booted by Jim Cumming. On the third occasion the Trojans failed to complete a pass when only seven yards way from a touchdown.

McWatters booted his single after Trojans had hopped on an Indian fumble on the visitors' 24-yard line. As McWatters' kick sailed over the goal post a man near the touchline tried to catch the ball and the officials called the play a foul in the goal area. The officials tried to chase the man away but he stood and was ready to fight.
