

BEACHES WIN ANOTHER ONE FROM WINDSOR

**Teddy Reeve's Big Crew
Beats Rockets
By 23-5**

TORONTO, Oct. 15.—The sport pages said Johnny Lake, former Blue Bomber, and Bob Cosgrove would be used "sparingly" against Windsor Rockets, but Rockets are convinced you can't believe everything you read in the papers.

IMPORTANT MEN

Fitted for football by two short practices since joining Toronto Balmy Beach, Lake and Cosgrove exploited their collective 440 pounds of talent anything but sparingly Saturday as Beaches took the aerial route to a 23-5 victory over the winless Windsor team.

Lake collected 11 Toronto points and Cosgrove was a smashing defensive factor in a victory which enabled Beaches to seize a share of the Ontario Rugby Football Union leadership with Toronto Indians, who had a bye in the schedule Saturday.

Rockets surprised about 1,500 fans in Maple Leaf Stadium with a scrappy performance, holding Beaches to a 7-5 half-time count, but in the last two quarters their battling young wingline buckled as Bobby Porter's forward passing, coupled with plunging by Lake and Doris Tipoff, sparked the home team to two converted touchdowns, a placement and a single while Rockets went scoreless.

BIG CHANCE

Windsor's one big moment came in the first quarter after Tommy Ford skirted their left and for the game's first touchdown which Lake converted. From near midfield, Rockets sumbled on a third-down forward pass from Del Willick to Bob Wylupek. Three plays later Sammy Sasso hurtled for a touchdown.

The convert attempt failed and in the second quarter Lake booted a single to make the count 7-5. In the third Joe Scislowski was rouged on Sammy Sward's hoist and Lake booted a placement to make it 11-5. Two converted touchdowns in the fourth quarter completed the scoring. Lake getting the first on a line play and outside Bus Moorehouse making a circus catch of one of Porter's forwards for the second.

The all-round Beach performance against a Windsor team which showed flashes of power stamped Beaches a definite threat for the O.R.F.U. title. The addition of Lake and Charlton, former Western Canada stars who joined the club Thursday, didn't hurt a bit.
