Trojans Display Team Class Play at Lansdowne Today

SARNIA, Ont., Oct. 12.—(Special).—Ottawa Trojans, in the midst of a spirited drive for second place in ORFU standings, swept to its third straight win here Saturday by whipping Sarnia Imperials 24-8 in a rough and tumble battle. The Trojans play again Monday in Ottawa with Windsor Rockets.

A small crowd, estimated at 2,500, watched Trojans completely outplay Sarnia for most of the game, while Imperials managed to avenge their wounds with a six-point last quarter drive. The teams played it rough and in the last quarter, tempers flared and Sarnia broke out at different stages of the season. A somewhat humorous touch was added for Sarnia fans when George Sprague was doused with a bucket of water near the end of the game by a Sarnia player.

Too Much Power

Trojans had too much power to the air and along the ground for the wireless Imps. Playing behind a charging line, Doug Smylie, Al Anderson, Ted McLarty and Johnny Prip consistently ripped through the Sarnia defense for long gains. Smylie, Masters and Bill Petricus scored the Ottawa touchdowns.

Doc Knowles, continuing his pace at a kicker, scored a jump scored for the Imps when he kicked a 24-yard field goal in the fourth quarter. It was a futile effort however as Trojans had built a 21-1 lead.

Doug Smylie was a power-house on the Ottawa attack all through the game. He scored the first touchdown in the first quarter, after setting it up with a 25-yard run. He then scored Sarnia's two yard line. He converted two touchdowns and one of Galloway's kicks back 40 yards in the third quarter.

Ted McLarty was another star, showing some deceptive ball handling. Pete Karpuk, a new addition to Trojans' roster, showed speed to turn and it was a pair of hands on the end of the game. He was the stage for Wally's quarter sneak touchdowns in the second quarter when he took a 20 yard leave from the Imperial 44 and scored to the eight yard line. His only weakness was unfamiliarity with some plays.

Masters Kick a Surprise.
Al Anderson was flying on some of his line plunges and he received some rough work on various occasions after making good gains. Masters directed the team well and pulled off the greatest play of the game when he returned Galloway's punt to Sarnia 17 yard line in the second quarter after receiving it from the Imperial 44 and scored to the eight yard line. This play seldom seen in Sarnia circles completely fooled the Imperials.

On the line the work of Don Harper and Red Smylie, Bob Gillen and Curly Morganha stood out. Harper and Smylie were ready if their down field tackling.

Rich Galloway, with his constant kicking, the Morris, veterans outside wing, and the passing of quarterback Bert Hume stood out in a poor day for Imperials.

Trojans made 18 first downs, four through the air while Sarnia made eight all in the last half.

Trojans finished on five occasions receiving three of them while Sarnia recovered all four of theirs. With Wally Masters doing most of the heaving, Sarnia's kick completed four of 12 passes while Sarnia completed five in the same number of attempts. Most of the latter aerial threats came in a last desperate drive while Trojans held out in each half.

Trojans Score Fast.
It didn't take long for the gold and red Trojans to score their first touchdown when Bob Gillen converted a blocked kick on Sarnia's 28 yard line in the first quarter. Bill Petricus bunched down the kick attempted by Hank Galloway. From here Doug Smylie broke through the Sarnia line for a 20 yard run to the two and then scored it over on the next play. He also converted.

Pete Karpuk refused another chance to score soon after this when he moved offside as Masters completed a pass to Ted McLarty on the Imperial five yard line on third down.

Joe Farley recovered a Sarnia fumble on the Ottawa 20 early in the second session and scored over the line but that line player's intervention was called and Trojans was deprived of a margin.

Petricus kicked a single and sent with these punting out the second quarter Wally Masters set up a scoring play with a pass to Pete Karpuk from Sarnia's 44 and he went to the eight yard line. Two plays later Masters sneaked over and Farley converted.

A safety touch in which Red Smylie blocked Galloway's attempted kick in the third quarter and a touchdown by Bill Petricus, converted by Doug Smylie ended the Trojans' scoring. With Red Hume doing most of the punting Imperials took to the air in the final frame and were rewarded with six points in a major by Doc Knowles and a single by Bill Wren.

Fighting at Finish.
Lally Lalonde, Trojans' end, and Neuge Kick Anderson were principals in the fighting which broke out at various stages of the final quarter. Their set to was the first and both players dropped it out for 30 seconds before Referee Tatters Gerard could separate them.
