Toronto Overcomes Lead Of Windsor in Last Half Attack

TORONTO—A smashing last-half ground attack which netted Toronto Balmy Beach all their points sent Windsor Rockets down to an 8-1 defeat here last night and gave the injury-riddled Toronto team undisputed possession of second place in the Ontario Rugby Football Union's standing.

Beaches, who played without several of their running backs and with others limping, came from behind with a converted touchdown and a single in the third quarter and another single in the last frame to overcome a one-point lead Rockets gained in the second quarter.

Felt more keenly by the Rocket than the loss of the game was the second-quarter injury to Snap Mike Prestanski, hurt in a line play. He was taken to hospital with a possible broken leg and was replaced by a lineman.

Unlike their last few games, the Beaches made few fumbles, veteran Johnny Lake, who has been used sparingly lately due to an injury, acting as a steadying influence. Beaches outplayed the Rockets for most of the floodlight tilt played before some 800 fans at Maple Leaf Stadium.

Windsor held their own in the first half of the game but each time they got within scoring range their attack bogged down, forcing them to kick. Halfbacks Joe Scislawski and Bill Addis ripped through the centre of the Beach line for good gains several times but in payoff territory the Beach line tightened to throw them back.

Bill Addis, who did most of the kicking for the Rockets, was out-kicked by the three players who shared the booting for the Beaches—Ford, Lake and Coulter.

The Toronto team drove for their touchdown less than seven minutes after the third quarter got underway, moving from the Windsor 33 yard line when Tommy Ford, who played a standout game on the Beach half, took them with a brilliant run back of a kick by Bill Addis.

MILLEN GOES OVER

Norm Millen plunged for 10 and after a short plunge, Quarterback Bruce Coulter slipped around the end for another 10 yards to the Windsor 13. Millen ripped through the centre twice, going over the second time for the touchdown which Coulter converted.

Several minutes later Coulter kicked to the deadline to put the Beaches in front, 7-1. In the last frame, Rocket Quarterback Gerry Dawson was rouged on Tommy Ford's kick for the Beaches' other point.

The Rockets held their own with the Beaches in the first half, going out in front with a 1-0 lead just as the second quarter got underway. Beach Halfback Bill Petri fumbled Addis' kick behind the line but managed to fall on it as a swarm of Rocket players tackled him.

The Windsor team's best scoring opportunity came in the last seconds of the game when Dawson made a spectacular 53-yard run back of a kick to the Beaches three-yard line. However, Stan Garbula failed to smash over for a major in the last play of the game which saw George Edwards, big Negro outside, break through to throw Garbula for a loss.

Edwards suffered a groin injury on the play and was lying on the field when the game ended. He
