

Locals Outclassed In Opening Contest

Air Filled With Filchock's Passes
Which Count Five Touchdowns

HAMILTON — Windsor Rockets, four years old in the Ontario Rugby Football Union, are flirting with disenfranchisement — the axe!

No football club that takes a 60-1 lambasting in a four-team circuit on opening day can reckon its position otherwise.

Nevertheless, Rockets insist a determination to improve follows.

Ing a slaughter at the hands of Hamilton Tigers, ex-Big Four members, that hasn't been surpassed since Sarnia torpedoes Ottawa Westmounts, 62-0, in 1928.

The crowd of 4,000 at Civic Stadium Saturday was regaled on one hand by the passing mastery of Tigers' playing-coach Frank Filchock and shocked on the other by Rockets' almost total collapse.

It was never a question for Windsor to come up with an offensive. Conversely, the problem of the day was how to stem the lightning attacks set in motion by Filchock and how to cope with his passing and the perfected blocking of his wing lines.

Rockets never found out. Tigers ripped from one end of the field to the other, tramping through

the middle, around the ends and completing passes until they had scored 10 converted touchdowns.

TOUCHDOWN TOSSES

Filchock fired five touchdown passes, three of them to Halfback Jack Stewart. The other two went to Bruce Maxwell and Gerry Walsh. In addition, Halfback Jack Harper tallied two tries by line-plunging. Walsh another by the same method and Ralph Bartolini and Jim Muzyka accounted for the remaining pairs when they gathered in Windsor fumbles behind the goal line.

Pat Santucci kicked six of the converts, Bartolini two and Red Atken and Joe Capriotti one apiece.

Rockets' avoided the technical infamy of a shutout early in the third quarter when Len Camlis attempted placement flew wide of the uprights and rolled to the deadline for a single. The break for the play came when Sid Livansov recovered a blocked Tiger kick at the Hamilton 27-yard line. Camlis belted around the left end to the 19 and hoisted his single from that point.

Indicative of the futility of their attack, Rockets made only two first downs in the entire contest. In the upstairs division, Rockets attempted 13 passes, completed three and saw 10 go haywire including four interceptions.

Tigers, however, flashed to no fewer than 21 first downs, completed nine out of 19 pass attempts and suffered no interceptions.

ONE BRIGHT STAR

Still, there was a star for Windsor, and to youthful Johnny Dengel, fullback, must go a tribute for his courageous struggle throughout the rout. Johnny kicked, passed and tackled until he was a mud-spattered figure on the field, and wound up with a wicked shiner under his right eye.

Only serious casualty to the Rockets occurred in the third quarter when Leo Herbert suffered a torn tendon in his left knee that will oust him for the rest of the season.

Rockets will make their first O.R.F.U. home appearance next Saturday against Toronto Beaches-Indians.
