

DUTCHIES RAP BEACH, 35 - 13, IN SR. O.R.F.U.

Blake Taylor Counts
Three Touchdowns
For K-W Squad

KITCHENER, (CP) — Kitchener-Waterloo Dutchmen romped to an easy 35-13 win over Toronto Balm Beach Saturday night in an Ontario Rugby Football Union game before 4,000 fans.

Paced by big Blake Taylor who scored three touchdowns, the Dutchmen were in control all the way. Halfback Billy Vessels, making a one-game appearance for the W.R.F.U. Edmonton Eskimos farm club, Don Siemon and Gerry MacTaggart got the other three majors for the winners.

Vessels scored his touchdown on a sensational play, outrunning two defenders to take a 15-yard forward pass from Bob Celeri. He also played defensive ball and featured with some fine open field tackling.

Siemon and MacTaggart took forward passes from Celeri for their touchdowns. MacTaggart's was a 10-yard heave by Celeri to the goal line. Don Amodio converted in five of six attempts.

The Dutchmen, in winning their home opener, came up with a considerably sharper effort than in their 23-19 defeat at Sarnia last Wednesday. They broke fast and were diving at the finish after pushing home two fourth quarter touchdowns.

Although they got three touchdowns on passes, they stuck pretty much to the ground and racked up 22 first downs. Celeri tossed 11 forwards and completed six for 154 yards. Willie Thriver tossed all but two of 21 Beach attempts and completed six for 101 yards.

Beaches made 14 first downs, seven in the second quarter when they scored 12 of their 13 points.

Thrower got the Beach moving through the air in the second half and with Nayland Moll featuring with some wide sweeping runs the Toronto attack looked good.

Maurice O'Callaghan took a five-yard, third down pass for the first Beach score and Greg Wilson took a 17-yarder for the second.

Most dramatic moment of the game was the drive leading to Vessels' score. Beaches had two runs from the Kitchener-Waterloo one-yard line and lost the ball on downs. Celeri then hit Paul Amodio with a 40 yard toss and Amodio ran through a broken field to the Beach 33. Then Vessels made his catch and scored.

Bob Schneidenbach, 1933 Beach centre played defensive ball for the Beach and tackled well. He and Vessels each got in their year as Canadians by playing in the game.
