

Bob Celeri Leader In 27-17 Win

Fumbles Prove Costly To Both, But K-W Finishes Well

KITCHENER — Led by the lame but tricky Bob Celeri at quarter, the Kitchener-Waterloo Dutchmen downed Sarnia Imperials 27-17, in a senior O.R.F.U. fixture here last night to move into a first place tie with the Imperials.

Both teams suffered heavily from fumbles, the three majors in the first half coming out of errors. While the Imps outplayed the Dutchmen in the first half and lost on fumbles, the Dutchies played smarter football in the third and fourth quarters.

Sarnia made 21 first downs to Kitchener's eight and Gino Cappelletti at quarter for the Imps threw 28 passes and completed 15 while Celeri and Graham for the Dutchies threw 15 for 9.

Kitchener opened the scoring early in the first quarter when Sokol fumbled a kick and Krebs recovered for the Dutchmen, on the Sarnia one yard line. Graham went over on a quick opener and the convert was good.

Twice during the first half Sarnia marched to the Dutchie line and was thrown back. Then Bobby Kuntz went off tackle 55 yards for the second Dutchie T.D.

In the second quarter Cappelletti brought his team to the Dutchie 25 where he fumbled and Cookie Gilchrist recovered and ran the remaining 75 for a T.D. The conversion was good.

Sarnia came back when the Dutchmen fumbled on their own 14 and Don Mattingly recovered. Chorostecki went through on a quick opener to the Dutchie nine and Cappelletti passed to Downs in the Kitchener end zone. The conversion attempt was blocked.

In the first minutes of the second half Celeri quick-kicked and Bruce Day was roughed to make the score 19-5 for Kitchener.

Sarnia recovered a Gilchrist fumble on the Kitchener 25. DuChene went through the Kitchener line twice to the nine and Dixon took Cappelletti's pass on the one. Red Jacobs went over on a hand off and the conversion was good, to make it 19-11.

Working from his own 37, Cappelletti threw three passes, two to Jacobs and the telling one to Dixon. The conversion was good and Sarnia moved within winning distance.

But Celeri had tricks up his sleeve. Faking a quick kick, he passed from his own 40 to the Sarnia five and Tonegusso went over. Sarnia blocked the conversion attempt.

Minutes later Dowsell went through centre to the Sarnia 25 and fumbled. Ceferi tried two passes and then Gilchrist kicked a placement to make it 27-17 for Kitchener.
