The passer given the highest efficiency rating in a week is the player who, during the season to date, has thrown an average of 20 passes per game and has achieved the best combination of pass completion percentage, average gain per pass, low percentage of interceptions and high percentage of touchdown passes. The highest possible rating would be obtained by the player who completed 77.5% of his passes for an average gain per pass attempt of 12.5 yards, threw no interceptions and completed one touchdown pass for every 8.4 passes thrown.

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#### 1993 GAME REVIEWS - WEEK #1

# Tuesday. July 6 - Winnipeg Blue Bombers 34 @ Calgary Stampeders 54

A rematch of the 1992 Grey Cup Final opened the 1993 CFL season on this night with the champion Calgary Stampeders defeating the Winnipeg Blue Bombers by a lopsided score of 54-34. CFL Most Outstanding Player and Grey Cup MVP QB Doug Flutie was outstanding running for 76 yards and 3 TDs while completing 16-of-30 passes for 192 yards and 2 TD tosses. A 67-yard punt return by Calgary's Peewee Smith opened the scoring just 2:42 into the 1st quarter. Flutie then ran in his first major of the game from the 1-yard line. Winnipeg QB Matt Dunigan then got down to business picking apart the Stampeder defence, marching his team 83 yards down the field and hooking up with David Williams from 4 yards out (converted by Troy Westwood) for his first TD pass of the night. Flutie then connected with Grey Cup Outstanding Canadian Dave Sapunjis to make the score 20-7 after 15 minutes of play. Winnipeg retaliated with 8 points of its own on a Bob Cameron punt and a 10-yard TD pass from Dunigan to Gerald Wilcox. After 2 Mark McLoughlin FGs (28 & 42 yards), Winnipeg conceded 2 points and on the following series, Flutie ran down the field himself on a quarterback sneak from the 50-yard line to put his team up 34-17 with 8 seconds left in the half. Flutie continued to show his magic in the second half as he ran in for a 6-yard TD and then set up McLoughlin for his 3rd FG of the night. Dunigan found Gerald Alphin down the lane for a 13-yard major and Williams once again, while Westwood kicked 2 more FGs, but it was too little, too late as the Stamps put the game out of reach with McLoughlin's 4th FG and a Flutie pass to Derrick Crawford to win their season opener in front of 25,486 fans at McMahon Stadium.

# Wednesday, July 7 - Sacramento Gold Miners 23 @ Ottawa Rough Riders 32

The first-ever CFL regular season game to be played by a team based outside of Canada was seen by 23,916 fans at the newly-renamed Frank Clair Stadium in Ottawa. The Rough Riders, who finished third in the East last season, demonstrated that they would be a team to contend with this year as the defence reached QB David Archer seven times throughout the night and and picked him off twice to close down the visiting team's offence. Ottawa QB Tom Burgess was outstanding as he completed 21-of-41 attempts for 373 yards and 3 TDs, including an 11-yard toss to Stephen Jones, a 61-yarder to Jock Climie in the first half and a 44-yard throw to W. Walker at the start of the third quarter. The Gold Miners could not get things rolling until the end of the 2nd frame when Archer found Mike Oliphant open from 8 yards out for the team's first points of the night. Oliphant then opened the second half scoring with his second major, an 8-yard run. An 18-yard toss from Archer to Bouyer made the score 28-22 for the home team before Miner K Jim Crouch added a single on a 47-yard missed FG attempt for a single. Ottawa kicker Terry Baker completed the Ottawa scoring with a FG and a single while Crouch missed his 3rd FG try of the night for another single but it was all Ottawa as they spoiled Sacramento's initiation into the League on this history-making night.

# Friday, July 9 - Saskatchewan Roughriders 26 @ B.C. Lions 32 (OT)

An outstanding performance by the B.C. Lion defence was the major contributor to the team's victory on Friday night at B.C. Place Stadium as 25,849 spectators watched their home team defeat the 'Riders in overtime. A total of 24 of the 33 B.C. points were scored as a result of turnovers as the Lions intercepted one pass (Tracy Gravely), knocked down 6 passes, blocked a punt and recovered the ball (Sean Millington), and sacked Saskatchewan QB Kent Austin 6 times throughout the night. Leo pivot Danny Barrett showed his stuff as he completed 28 of 47 passes for 368 yards and 2 TDs, including a 20-yard pass to Ray Alexander in the 1st O/T period after rookie punter Mike Vanderjagt was tackled on 3rd down by veteran Less Browne to give up the ball on his own 39-yard line. Barrett opened the scoring by tossing a 12-yarder to Matt Clark and 18-year veteran K Lui Passaglia counted his first 3-pointer of the night to make the score 10-0 after the 1st quarter. Saskatchewan K Dave Ridgway connected on a boot from 36 yards out and one from 17 yards to give his team their first points in the 2nd period while B.C. RB Chris Skinner completed a 25-yard drive with a 1-yd. TD to give the Lions a 17-6 edge at the half. After exchanging FGs in the 3rd quarter, Passaglia scored his 3rd FG on the night, before Jeff Fairhold caught a spectacular pass from Austin for a 75-yard major. Another exchange of FGs brougt the score to 26-19. With less than 2 minutes left in the game, Austin again found his receiver, this time CFL Outstanding Canadian Ray Elgaard, to send the game into extra innings. Over 900 yards of offence contributed to a wide open contest as the Lions got off to a better start than expected after their 3-15 record of last season.

#### Saturday, July 10 - Sacramento Gold Miners 14 @ Hamilton Tiger-Cats 30

In anticipation of making history by being the first American team to win a CFL game, the Sacramento Gold Miners were stiffled by the Hamilton Tiger-Cat defence on a hot, muggy evening at Ivor Wynne Stadium. 20,307 spectators watched as their home team's defensive unit showed that they were products of that Steel City mentality, sacking Gold Miner QB David Archer 5 times and picking off 3 of his passes, including a 55-yard touchdown return by Gary Wilkerson (who later set up another TD after an interception) to increase Hamilton's lead by 17 points in the last quarter. After playing their first game in Ottawa less than 72 hours before, the Gold Miners were unable to get things going until the second quarter, when K Jim Crouch missed his 4th FG attempt in a row (3 vs. Ottawa) for a single and then finally connected from 17 yards out to make the score 7-4. Ti-Cat K Paul Osbaldiston booted his first of 3 FGs just before the 2 teams headed for the half-time break. The 3rd quarter only saw Wilkerson's major while a 56-yard TD pass from QB Don McPherson to Scott Walker put the game out of reach for the visitors. Ozzie's 2nd and 3rd FGs sandwiched Sacramento's only TD, a 4-yard toss by Archer to Rod Harris to wrap up the win for the Tabbies.

#### Saturday, July 10 - Toronto Argonauts 8 @ Edmonton Eskimos 38

In a game loaded with errors, the Edmonton Eskimos seemed to have benefitted the most from the biggest trade in CFL history from last January as they trounced the visiting team 38-8 in front of a crowd of 26,336 at Commonwealth Stadium. Former Argonaut QB Rickey Foggie connected with 3 of his receivers while former Tiger-Cat pivot Damon Allen threw 1 TD pass as the Eskimos took a 17-1 lead to the dressing room at half-time. Allen had found Jim Sandusky to open the scoring at 9:34 of the first frame with an 25-yard toss, while K Sean Fleming booted the convert and then a FG before Lance Chomyc missed on a 35-yard FG attempt in the 2nd quarter to put the Argonauts on the board. Sandusky then caught an 11-yard pass from Foggie at 13:07 of the second for his 2nd major of the night. Foggie again connected in the 3rd, as he threw a 46-yard pass to Henry "Gizmo" Williams and then a 29-yard strike to Eddie Brown (also a member of the trade). It seemed like Toronto came out ready to play the game in the third quarter as Warren Hudson, the former Winnipeg FB, scrambled into the end zone from the 1-yard line to get Toronto's first TD of the night after a long 72-yard drive up the field led by QB Tracy Ham. But that would be all of their scoring as the Eskies took over, racking up their 3 TDs in a row, making the count 38-8 with no points being scored in the final period.

#### SOME FACTS FIGURES AND RECORDS BROUGHT TO YOU BY GESTETNER

As the curtain rised on another CFL season last week, three of the League's "Iron Men" continued their consecutive games streaks. Winnipeg punter <u>Bob Cameron</u> leads the way amongst active players, with 217 games played. Argonaut linebacker <u>Don Moen</u>, who played in his 191st consecutive game, is being chased by Saskatchewan kicker <u>Dave Ridgway</u> who has participated in 190 straight games.

As the <u>Edmonton Eskimos</u> took to the field at Commonwealth Stadium, they brought with them a remarkable streak of 16 straight "first game of the season" wins. They streached that streak to 17 with their 38-8 victory over the <u>Toronto Argonauts</u> on Saturday night. The Eskimos have not missed the playoffs since 1972. The Argonauts have now lost 10 consecutive games on the road dating back to 1991. The last time they were victorious in a visiting ball park was on October 27, 1991 when they defeated the <u>Hamilton Tiger-Cats</u> by a score of 39-34 at Ivor Wynne Stadium. The Tiger-Cats lay claim to the longest road winless streak, which stands at 26 games. They went 0-24-2 from October 6, 1945 to September 2, 1950.

Henry "Gizmo" Williams was up to his old tricks in Edmonton's win over Toronto, returning a <u>Hank llesic</u> punt 76 yards for the major. This marked the 18th time in his 7-year CFL career that "The Giz" has returned a punt for a TD. He needs only 370 more punt return yards to overtake the all-time leader <u>Paul Bennett</u> who holds the CFL record for Most Punt Return Yards with 6,358.
