WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 2 - BALTIMORE STALLIONS 19 AT EDMONTON ESKIMOS 12 - 30,698

Baltimore and Edmonton entered this game with equal 4 and 1 records including both teams having 1 and 1 records when playing teams outside their division. This, along with the dynamic running of Mike Pringle against the tough Edmonton defence led by the League's leading tackler Willie Pless built up to an exciting game. The only scoring of the first quarter came when Baltimore center Mike Withycombe sent a snap over punter Josh Miller's head and into the endzone for a safety. Both defences continued to dominate in the second quarter. Kicker Sean Fleming booted his first field goal of the day from 12 yards out to extend the Edmonton lead to 5-0. The next two scores of the game came off the foot of Stallion kicker Carlos Huerta. Two field goals from 37 yards moved the Stallions into a 6 to 5 lead. Defensive back Charles Anthony scored the only touchdown of the game when he intercepted a Kerwin Bell pass and ran it back 54 yards for the major. Huerta converted the play extending Baltimore's lead going into the half to 13 to 5. The Stallions opened the scoring early in the second half. Chris Wright ran the opening kick off back 62 yards giving the Baltimore offence excellent field position. Huerta capitalized by making good on a 46 yard field goal attempt. The Eskimos had the next kick at the can. Fleming missed this field goal attempt from 47 yards but did score a single point. Later in the quarter Fleming redeemed himself hitting a 19 yard field goal attempt to bring the Eskimos within a touchdown of a tie. Huerta hit his fourth field goal of four attempts for the game. His 22 yard score firmshed the scoring for the third quarter. Fleming made a field goal from 21 yards out early in the quarter which ended up being the only scoring of the quarter as both defences dug in. Baltimore took the victory after holding Edmonton off the score board for the final 12:41 of the game.

THURSDAY, AUGUST 3 - HAMILTON TIGER-CATS 20 AT TORONTO ARGONAUTS 16 (OT) - 19,174

One of the oldest rivalries in the CFL set the stage for one of these two teams to break their tie in the Northern Division standings at 2 wins and 3 losses. Toronto opened the scoring at 10:07 of the first quarter when Wayne Lammle hit a 48 yard field goal. On the ensuing kick off Sam Rogers returned the ball to the 55 yard line giving Hamilton excellent field position. The five play drive that followed ended with an 11 yard touchdown run by quarterback Steve Taylor. Paul Osbaldiston made the convert giving the Ti-Cuin Line lead 7 to 3 at the end of the first quarter. This proved to be the only touchdown of the game. Lammle made his second field goal of the game, this time from 11 yards out. Osbaldiston made his first field goal of the night at 8:06 of the second quarter. This attempt came from the 37 yard line. The Argonauts notched a single when Lammle punted the ball 40 yards into the Ti-Cat endzone. Lammle tie the ball game before half time with a 40 yard field goal. Lammle sent the field goal attempt wide but was unable to score the single as Lee Knight punted the ball out of the endzone. In the first overtime half, Osbaldiston hit two field goals from 27 and 8 yards respectively. The second overtime saw Toronto fight back with a 43 yard field goal by Lammle. Hamilton rounded out the scoring with Osbaldiston punting into the Argo endzone for a single. Hamilton moved into sole possession of fourth place with the win.

THURSDAY, AUGUST 3 - BIRMINGHAM BARRACUDAS 23 AT B.C. LIONS 30 (OT) - 21,948

The second overtime game of the night was played at B.C. Place Thursday night. The battle pitted two of the Leagues hottest quarterbacks facing off for the first time this season. Fans were not disappointed as they witnessed over 800 yards passing from the two QBs. The Lions opened the scoring on their first drive of the game. Sean Millington ran the ball in from the 1 yard line for touchdown. League all-time leading scorer Lui Passaglia kicked the convert. On B.C.s next possession, Passaglia booted a 45 yard field goal to give the Lions an early 10 to 0 lead. With no time left on the clock in the first quarter, 'Cuda quarterback Matt Dunigan threw a 26 yard pass to Marcus Grant for a touchdown. Birmingham kicker Franco Grilla converted the play. Dunigan and the powerful 'Cuda offence was shut down the rest of the way by a tough B.C. Lion defence. The victory game the Lions sole possession of second place in the Northern Division at the end of week six.

FRIDAY, AUGUST 4 - SASKATCHEWAN ROUGHRIDERS 31 AT OTTAWA ROUGH RIDERS 20 - 20,830

This game was a battle between the two Roughriders or Rough Riders, depending how you look at it. Saskatchewan was looking to break their five game losing streak, while Ottawa had not won a game since their home-opener against Winnipeg. The Green Riders got on the scoreboard first with an eight play scoring drive beginning at the Saskatchewan 42 yard line. QB Warren Jones completed his first five passes, including the 5-yarder to WR Donald Narcisse for the 6 points. K Dave Ridgway added the convert for another point.
